The United Thank Offering has been empowering new ministry across the globe for more than 125 years. UTO grants can be used to start up and fund new ministries, or to help take existing ministries in new and exciting directions.

Applications are available yearly on the first Friday in December at episcopalchurch.org/uto.

The possibilities are nearly endless for what a UTO grant can help you do. Please be sure to review the criteria and focus on the grant application to see if your budding ministry is fundable.

Also, take a look at our list of past grants for an idea of what amounts we generally award and what projects we have previously funded. We want you to ask for what you need, but we also want to fund as many eligible requests as possible.

One application is accepted per diocese and per province of the Anglican Communion.

One additional application can be accepted from a diocese of The Episcopal Church for a companion/partnership grant.

Grants of up to \$5,000 are available.

Who can apply?

Young adults between the ages of 19 and 30, with the approval and signature of their bishop

Seminarians or people of any age at an accredited seminary, in a diocesan ordination formation program, or from the the Commission for Theological Education for Latin America and the Caribbean (CETALC), with the approval and signature of their bishop (and dean or chair)

Applications are available yearly on the first Friday in August at episcopalchurch.org/uto.
